AN - ORDINANCE .

To prevent injury or annoyance from dangerous practices in the Village of Ottoville, Putnam County, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Ottoville, in the County of Putnam and State of Ohio:-

Section I. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, wilfully and knowingly to discharge fire arms, or to shoot a revolver, pistol, shot-gun, rifle, flobert rifle, or other gun laden with powder or other explosive, with or without missile, except on the fourth day of July, or to shoot any so-called air-gun laden with missile, within the corporate limits of said Village of Ottoville.

Section 2. That any person or persons, violating the provisions of Section I. of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding twenty five (\$25.00) dollars, and pay the costs of prosecution, and stand committed to the Village prison until such fine and costs are paid or secured to be paid.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication according to law.
