

PROHIBITING PARKING OF SEMI-TRAILERS ON STREETS AND ALLEYS
WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF OTTOVILLE, OHIO

Be It Ordained by the Council of the Village of Ottoville, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to park and leave standing a semi-trailer upon the streets and alleys of the Village of Ottoville for more than two (2) hours.

This section shall not apply to the driver of any vehicle which is disabled while on the streets and alleys of said Village of Ottoville or to the driver of any vehicle which is being loaded or unloaded.

SECTION 2. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for a first offense and for the second and subsequent convictions within one year thereafter by a fine of not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).

SECTION 3. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate protection of the public health, safety, and welfare, and shall go into effect forthwith. The reason for said emergency is the necessity of preventing driving hazards created by the parking of semi-trailers and preventing damage to the streets and alleys of said village.
